



## **DAMAGE PREVENTION POLICY**

### **Policy Statement**

Ikkuma Resources Corp., is committed to preventing damage to our pipelines through effective public awareness and damage prevention programs to ensure the safety of the public, stakeholders, workers, property and the environment.

#### **Ikkuma Resources Corp. is committed to:**

- Conducting hazard assessments to identify, control hazards, potential hazards, to manage the risks and consequences of damage to Ikkuma's facilities;
- Training field operations personnel to perform work in compliance with regulations and company operating procedures;
- Maintaining a public awareness program to inform, educate, and enhance awareness of Ikkuma's pipelines in order to prevent, manage and mitigate damage to pipelines;
- Promoting the use of "call/click before you dig" services such as Alberta One Call and BC One Call and directing the digging community to obey the markings and directions of Ikkuma in relation to activities;
- Working collaboratively with industry peers and organizations to share and improve damage prevention efforts designed to enhance stakeholders' understanding;
- Reporting unauthorized activities to the National Energy Board (NEB), to facilitate investigation and prevent recurrence;
- Continuously improving damage prevention efforts by regularly reviewing program effectiveness and assessing hazards, controls and risk to determine the need for program modifications.
- Support incident, hazard/near miss, and potential hazards reporting and investigations and ensure corrective actions are taken; that person(s) reporting will be granted immunity from disciplinary action;
- Measuring and documenting targets on damage prevention;

## **DAMAGE PREVENTION OBJECTIVES**

### **Our GOAL → Zero pipeline incidents**

1. Prepare, maintain and communicate the public awareness and damage prevention programs in place which are dedicated to ensuring the safety of those living and working near our facilities to prevent damage to Ikkuma's pipelines.
2. Promote and follow ground disturbance laws which require:
  - a) line locating and staking within 30m of a pipeline/facility;
  - b) positive confirmation of a pipeline/facility if working within 5m; and
  - c) prohibiting mechanical excavation within 0.6m of the pipeline/facility unless under the direct supervision of an Ikkuma representative
3. Report activities near our pipelines/facilities internally and to energy regulators as required.
